RESOLUTIONS FORM
Feb. 1, 2022 Precinct Caucus

STEPS TO CHANGE THE PLATFORM of the REPUBLICAN PARTY of MINNESOTA:

1. Resolutions that are passed at the **Precinct Caucus** will be forwarded to the **2022 BPOU Convention**. The **BPOU Convention** votes on these Resolutions, requiring a simple majority to pass.
2. Resolutions that are passed at the **BPOU Convention** are then forwarded to the **2022 Congressional District Convention** where they are voted on; a simple majority is required to pass.
3. Resolutions that are passed at the **Congressional District Convention** will then be forwarded to the **2022 State Convention** where they are voted on.
4. Resolutions that are passed at the 2022 State Convention are incorporated into the **Standing Platform** of the **Republican Party of Minnesota**.

You may wish to review the **Standing Platform of the Republican Party of Minnesota** before writing your proposed Resolution. You may submit a resolution that is already covered in the Platform, or to change some of the words in the current Standing Platform, or to add something new. The Convention committees will handle all those appropriately.

A maximum-5-minute discussion, pro and con alternately, will commence. A vote will take place and if passed, this Resolution will be forwarded to the BPOU Convention. Give your resolution to the Secretary after voting.

I move that this precinct caucus support the following resolution: (use back if more space needed)

We support Minnesota legislation to protect dogs from lethal traps and snares.

For example, the group "Dog Lovers 4 Safe Trapping MN" has proposed that we:

- * Replace lethal snares on land with non-lethal "cable restraints" (as in Wisconsin).
- * Restrict lethal (body-gripping) traps to sets that are relatively safe for dogs: five feet above the ground, underwater, or in enclosures that exclude dogs (as in the northern Maine "Lynx Exclusion Devices").

As proposed in the following bills now before the Minnesota Legislature:

- * HF 2086 by Rep. Peter Fischer and Rep. Jamie Becker-Finn; and
- * SF 2142 by Sen. Jim Abeler, Sen. John A. Hoffman, and Sen. Charles W. Wiger.
